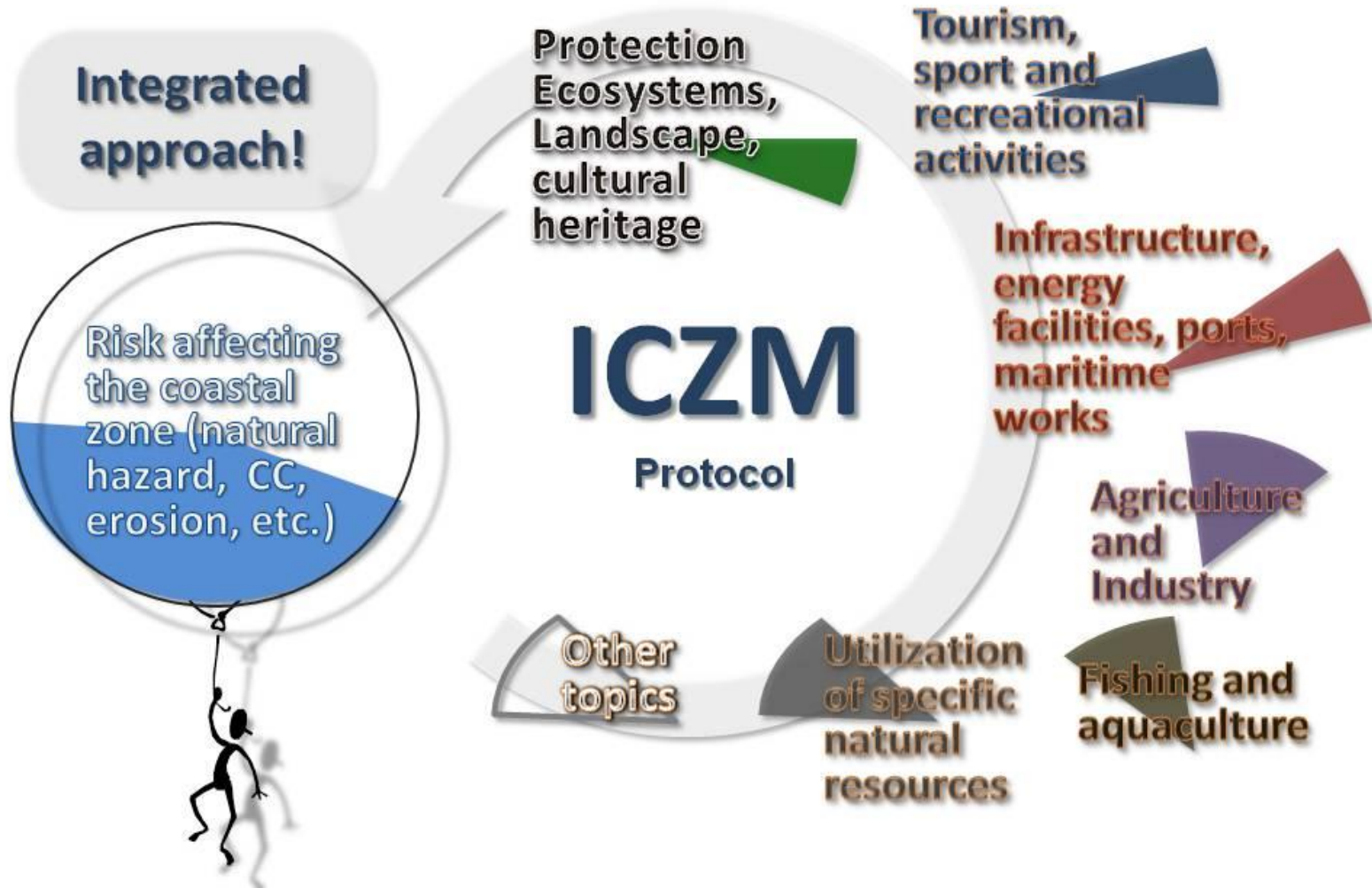
- 3 years project, cofunded by the MED Programme, ended in June 2013
- Developed by the CPMR InterMediterranean Commission (Maritime WG coordinated by Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Region)
- Coordinated by Region Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Region, involved twelve regional partners from France, Italy, Spain, Greece and Cyprus together with the Conference of Peripheral Maritime Regions and its InterMediterranean Commission
- Deliverables are available on the MAREMED website (www.maremed.eu):
 - Policy recommendations adopted by the CPMR-Intermediterranean Commission
 - Technical reports

- Focus on the Integrated Maritime Policy and framework conditions for Blue Growth in the Mediterranean basin :
 - Integrated Coastal Zone Management
 - Adaptation to climate change in coastal areas
 - Coastal and maritime data management
 - Fisheries
 - Pollution
- Beyond its technical dimension, impact at EU level, through Regular interaction with EU institutions (e.g. MAREMED final seminar organised in the European Parliament in March 2013) and connection with the action of the CPMR in the maritime field
- Beyond its technical dimension, impact at interregional level through :
 - Contribution to the structuration of long-term collaboration between Regions (e.g. Contribution to the development of the Bologna Charter, signed at the occasion of the MAREMED seminar in March 2013)

BOLOGNA CHARTER

- Aimed at the strengthening of the role of the coastal Administrations in the context of European policies and initiatives at the Mediterranean scale
- Also promotes a Macro-Project initiative designed for a coherent Mediterranean macro-thematic and multi-sectoral strategy,
- Bologna Charter 2007, born in the BEACHMED-project, www.beachmed.eu), “Charter 2012”, developed within the MAREMED project (www.maremed.eu) with the support of the FACECOAST Med-cluster (www.facecoast.eu)
- Expected to be signed by about 20 Mediterranean coastal Administrations (tentatively in March 2013 in Bruxelles) and then potentially by all others
- Process now embedded in the CPMR InterMediterranean Commission, with Emilia-Romagna as a leader

BOLOGNA CHARTER – examples of propositions

- Network of existing coastal observatories
- Survey of erosion and flood hazards
- Promote sustainable use of strategic resources to face littoralization, climate change, sediments
- Foster integrated territorial planning
- Design and execute structural works in the MED area
- Foster clustering initiatives like Facecoast

CPMR InterMediterranean Commission interested in developing further structured cooperation between Med Regions in the maritime field.

Specific interest in 2 specific elements in the last MED call :

- Priority 4 - Maritime Spatial Planning and Integrated Coastal Zone Management (link with Bologna Charter and Regions involved in this process will here be essential)
- Priority 4 - Capitalisation and communication project
